SOMERTON CONSERVATION AREA REVIEW

Meeting 21st February 2017 at Edgar Hall. The SSDC Conservation team is undertaking a review of the Somerton Conservation Area which was first designated in 1970 and then extended in 1978 - a considerable time ago. As the planning authority the Council is required to carry out conservation area reviews from time to time and Somerton is now well overdue for such a review. It is in fact the last market town in the district that has yet to be reviewed. The purpose is to ensure that the conservation area boundary is still appropriate, to correct any anomalies and to consider whether any additional parts of the town warrant inclusion now need to be excluded. An open meeting will be held at Edgar Hall on Tuesday 21st February following the Planning meeting which commences at 7pm.

SOMERTON TOWN COUNCIL BUDGET / PRECEPT FOR 2017/18

The 2017 / 18 budget has been approved by STC at £403,676 with a release from reserves of £68276. The precept (council tax) is to be set at £328490, an increase of 2% per band D property equating to 7p per week.

HOW TO RECYCLE YOUR XMAS TREE

With 250,000 Christmas trees being taken down in Somerset, what is the best solution to ensure it is recycled right, from composting a real tree to recycling anything artificial and broken? Trees that are "natural and naked" - real and with all decorations removed - can be taken to any recycling site to be composted into the Revive soil conditioner.

Garden waste subscribers can put out their undecorated real trees with their bin or paper sack collections, which resume from Monday.

South Somerset District Council has set up 30 chipping points, where residents can leave their tree up to Monday 16 January and even collect chippings to use as a garden mulch. STAY SAFE AND WELL IN SEVERE WEATHER

Somerset County Council is urging people to take extra care and look out for others during the cold and icy weather as the Met Office issues a Level 3 cold weather alert for the South West.

The alert is triggered when there is 90% probability of severe cold weather and icy conditions or snow over the next few days which could increase the health risks to vulnerable people and disrupt the delivery of services.

The local Somerset NHS advises that A&E and 999 services are for life-threatening and serious conditions only. Your local high-street pharmacy can help with minor illnesses and complaints such as coughs, colds, flu, stomach upsets, aches and sprains. If you feel it's not a 999 emergency but you need medical help fast, dial 111. If you are concerned about your health or somebody you care for, advice can be obtained from NHS 111 or your local pharmacist.

DEMENTIA DARNINGS' COMING TO ACEARTS

As ACEart's exhibition programme for 2017 gets into full swing, the charity is inviting new volunteers to join it and help further its success.

Jenni Dutton's 'Dementia Darnings' show will run from 18th March until 15th April and explores the effects of the ageing process and dementia through large scale portraits of her mother in wool and thread. Jenni will be holding an Artists Talk on 1st April 2-4pm. The exhibition at ACEarts follows Jan Niedojadlo's 'Podules', in which visitors can climb inside the sculptures, and which runs from 11th February until 11th March.

A second exciting event will be taking place whilst 'Dementia Darnings' is on show. As a charity, ACEarts relies on a network of volunteers and supporters to help its activities, both with fundraising and other efforts. It is hoping to expand its network and is therefore holding a 'Coffee, Cake and Chat' session on 7th April between 10am and 12 noon.

MISSING CD OR BOOKLET




