# A life-long commemoration

The trees commemorating Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee celebration have now been planted. The ceremony took place at King Ina School in the presence of some of the pupils, school staff and members of Somerton Town Council.



### Commemorative Trees

Somerton Town Council are continuing to plant commemorative trees in celebration of the Queen's 70<sup>th</sup> Jubilee. We have made progress but still have several trees to site. We're asking Somerton residents if they would consider having a tree or trees planted by us on their property.

The trees will be a mixture of native British trees, and the planting needs to be in a front garden within Somerton. The Council will plant the trees but after that the welfare of the tree will be the responsibility of the recipient. The reason for the front garden planting would be so that the whole community can appreciate the trees, and their beauty for years to come.

# Community Awards and Annual Town Meeting

There was excellent attendance by residents and clubs, supported by the Somerton Guides who assisted with refreshments. Chairs of the Town Council's committees and the chair of the Council provided overviews of the previous year and presentations were given by the following groups.

Somerset and Avon Police outlined the neighbourhood policing and emergency response for Somerton. Over the last 12 months, Somerton recorded a flat crime level. Online reporting can be done anonymously and the police work with various organisations to reduce crime and enable more people to feel safe.

Citizens Advice Bureau (CAB) returned to the Library in February, Mondays 10.00am to 1.00pm. Benefits, debt, and homelessness are the top issues raised. Over a six-week period CAB helped 37 clients, addressing 137 different issues. The CAB service includes providing information, advice, and casework support. A money worries programme and an evening support service which helps working people in financial difficulties to access help is also available.

### **Grant Recipients**

St Cleers Community Kitchen - incorporating the Warm Hub.

Somerton Recreation Ground Trust – contribution to the maintenance of the sports field, hedge cutting, cleaning of public toilets.

St John Ambulance - in support of a new community support vehicle.

Lady Smith Memorial Institute - annual insurance.

Community Speed Watch -room hires.

Somerton Guides Association – contribution towards camping equipment.

Somerton Scout group – landscaping the grounds to be used for camping and outdoor games. Somerton Good Neighbours – the scheme started during covid, collecting prescriptions and shopping for vulnerable people. Last year they launched a transport scheme and in January 2023 a memory café for those with dementia and their carers. The grant provided covered their insurance.

Winners of the community awards were presented with trophies, and certificates were given to the nominees on the evening.

### Grants awarded April, May, and June 2023

Ace Arts – for promotion and publicity to improve footfall and bring visitors to the Somerton monthly market held on the first Friday of the month in Market Place.

Gardeners' Club – use of Edgar Hall for the Annual Summer flower show - 19th August 2023. Supporting the gardening club awards with use of Edgar Hall and as we have in previous years with trophies, certificates, and vouchers for the winners of the front garden competition. Football Club – to support the cost of training for coaches and obtaining football coaching certificates.

### Grants awarded April, May, and June 2023 continued

ArchiesXtra – support refreshments and a listening ear within a safe space for young people to come to whilst using facilities such as the skate park and leisure facilities at the recreational ground.

Somerton Rugby Club – the club would like to address the limited opportunities for girls' and ladies' rugby in the local area and increase inclusivity at the club, enabling people with disabilities to watch and participate. Locally there is little for those who are disabled, and the rugby club would like to ensure disabled participants and supporters can be a part of the rugby club and the community.

Somerset Food Trail Festival – the festival is held over a two-week period and in 2023 runs from 14th to 30th July 2023. The festival promotes nature friendly food and farming. The grant is to help promote the food trail festival as our local Somerton businesses are promoted as part of the trail.

# Pedestrian crossing update

Vistry Housebuilding Site Adoptions team have confirmed they are actively looking to erect the missing streetlight column. However, they were unable to position the column in its original position due to several factors. These include overhead cables and underground services, which have impacted the installation. A new street lighting position has been agreed, and detail provided to an appointed contractor, and they are now waiting for quotes to be submitted. Once the quotes have been received and agreed, they will proceed with commissioning the works. The new light will be installed as soon as practically possible. Update to follow in August.

### Water, water, water

We'd like to remind residents that only storm water is allowed to enter the drainage system. Please do not pour anything else into the drainage system.

Vistry Housebuilding South West has reported that whilst conducting routine servicing to the storm water pumping station, they discovered a film of oil on the surface of the water. They conducted checks and the only route by which



the oil could have found its way into the chamber is via road gullies. They do not know the exact location of where the oil entered; however, this can only be from the Somerton development. Had conditions have been wet, then this oil could have found its way into a local river. Please can we stress the importance of disposing of oil, or any detergents, in a safe way so as not to cause an environmental incident, contamination, or cause harm to the local environment or wildlife. You can dispose of oil via your local waste recycling centre.

# Bag it, and bag it again

A polite reminder that if dog waste bins are full and you use an alternative street bin to dispose of your dog's business, please ensure you double bag it.

### On the buses

A presentation was given on the Bus Service Improvement Plan by the Somerset Council Transport and Highways project team members at the full town council meeting on 13<sup>th</sup> June 2023.

The rural mobility hub in Somerton is intended to give bus passengers an interchange facility between services, and

provide live information on bus times. The location for the hub is proposed at Market Place, with other elements such as bike parking potentially to be located at the Brunel precinct area. If the budget allows, they would also like to include elements within or close to the hub to facilitate other modes of onward travel. There are many options for what could be included, for example ebike hire and/or parking. The aim of the hub is to increase the opportunity for local travel, reduce cost, improve control, provide easily accessible transport, and contribute to decarbonisation plans. Somerset Council have received funding to put in a rural mobility hub in Somerton involving digital demand responsive transport to link up transport and make it more accessible. Proposed to be delivered in 2024, the next steps include consultation with various associations to identify components of the hub. Further updates in coming months.

# Community Plan 2023-2028

The Steering Committee is in the process of drafting a mini report which will highlight popular suggestions from within the community. Feedback from the community included bringing back a Somerton Cricket club, introducing a community shed and cinema. Town Council members initiated some of the town's projects such as the community shed, movie night, and Christmas lights, and are now seeking volunteers to assist and progress the development of these projects. A volunteer evening is currently being planned and it is hoped this will be held in September in the Parish rooms. Further information to be provided in August.

Our soccer school, for children aged four to six, allows children to learn basic skills in a fun, friendly and playful environment. Children then progress into teams U7 to U16. Through a combination of structured training sessions, matches and tournaments, young players have the chance to refine their technique, improve their physical fitness, and enhance their tactical understanding of the game. Our dedicated volunteers provide expert guidance, creating a supportive and nurturing environment that helps players reach their full potential.

Somerton Town Youth Football Club also fosters valuable life skills beyond the football pitch. By promoting teamwork, sportsmanship, and fair play, the club instils important values in its members. Children learn the importance of collaboration, communication, and respect for both teammates and opponents.

### Our plans for the future?

Our volunteers are working to improve and grow the club so we can provide more opportunities to children in our community. We have been supported by parents, many local businesses, Somerton Recreational Ground and Somerton Town Council. A recent grant from Somerton Town Council will provide training for volunteers to improve safeguarding, first aid and coaching skills, with the aim of implementing safeguarding best practice.




