A well-respected colleague, formidable advocate of Somerton and truly remarkable man. For more than a decade Cllr Dean Ruddle served at every level of local government including Unitary Councillor at Somerset Council (formerly Somerset County Council) and Chair of Somerton Town Council.

Cllr Ruddle's motivation in his work with Somerton Town Council and beyond was always to achieve the very best for the community. He brought a huge amount of energy, commitment and enthusiasm, giving endless time in support of Somerton. He fought tirelessly for the residents of Somerton and also for Somerset as portfolio holder for adult social care working to protect the most vulnerable in our society. Cllr Ruddle's knowledge of Somerton,



its residents and the role of the Town Council was encyclopaedic. Described as "Mr Somerton" this truly reflects how passionate he was about the town and how committed he was to ensuring that the voices of Somerton residents were heard. Known by so many residents, he was approachable, forthright and committed to resolving issues and this is reflected in the heavy loss felt by so many at his sudden passing.

Cllr Ruddle was a wonderful, kind, and supportive man both to our Town Councillors and the Clerk's office. His guidance, advice, knowledge, encouragement and help will be sorely missed.

A true family man, proud of all they did and achieved, our thoughts and deepest sympathy go out to his family at this difficult time.

Precept for the financial year 2024/25

The Precept is the amount of money which Somerton Town Council submits a demand to Somerset Council asking them to collect funds on our behalf through your council tax.

The precept is set following the council setting the annual budget. The budget is a detailed financial plan estimating what the council will need to spend money on during the year less any estimated income. The budget is prepared annually following the detailed review of the councils activities looking into both income and expenditure for all areas which the Town Council are responsible for, also taking into consideration the planned capital expenditure (projects) such as collecting funds for the Cemetery expansion project, pavement repair works to West Street and new or replacement playground equipment.

The Precept for 2024/25 was set at £625,592 for 2024/25. You can find detail of this in the minutes of the full town council meeting held on 16th January 2024 on the council's website. somertontowncouncil.gov.uk /agendas-and-minutes.

Somerset Wildlife Trust launches new project to support local communities

Wilder Communities 30x30 is a new 3-year project recently launched by Somerset Wildlife Trust and funded through The National Lottery Heritage Fund. Made possible by funds raised by National Lottery players, the project aims to support the



development of "Nature Recovery corridors" in South and East Somerset by encouraging local communities to take action for the wildlife right on their doorsteps and help create a resilient, nature-rich landscape for both wildlife and people to enjoy.

Only around 10% of Somerset can currently be classified as being in good natural or semi-natural condition, with species-rich natural habitats supporting abundant and diverse wildlife. Nature Recovery Networks are interconnected habitats operating at a landscape scale and are recognised as an important approach to reversing the decline in nature and restoring ecosystem health — vital to support clean air, water, soils, and providing health and wellbeing opportunities.

Through the new Wilder Communities 30x30 project, Somerset Wildlife Trust will work with local communities to establish the support and resources needed to co-design activities to create more space for wildlife in community spaces, gardens, verges, parks, and schools, joining up pre-existing green spaces and contributing to the Nature Recovery Network.

Prestigious Guild of Master Craftsmen

After a rigorous selection process, Somerton-based Gunmaker Mr Gareth Rule has been accepted into the Guild of Master Craftsmen, one of the oldest and most established Guilds in the UK.

The Guild of Master Craftsmen continues a great tradition established by the guilds of medieval Europe, and Mr Rule has now been named as one of only three gunmakers in the UK to be bestowed with this recognition and honor. As part of the Guild, Gareth will now be able to ensure his name and skills are seen alongside some of Britain's best artisans and makers.

Gareth was trained by his father, Mr Anthony Rule, a Master Gunstock Maker. He officially joined his father's business, A W Rule and Son Gunmakers Ltd in 1996 and completed his formal apprenticeship with The Worshipful Company of Gun Makers and The Gun Trade Association in 2005.

After the sudden death of his father in 2010, Gareth took over the 60-year-old family business, developing and expanding the company.

Whatever their craft, skill or profession, members of The Guild of Master Craftsmen are thoroughly assessed to earn the right to be called master craftsmen. Once accepted, they are required to maintain The Guild's aims and objectives to retain their membership, upholding skill, integrity and excellence at all times.

Whilst the majority of Guild members are modern day craftsmen drawing from building and allied trades, the Guild also represents traditional craftsmen such as cabinet makers, French polishers, furniture restorers, upholsterers, blacksmiths, thatcher's, masons and stoneworkers. The wide Guild family has over 500 different trades.

Director of the Guild of Master Craftsmen says, "We are delighted to welcome such a fine gunmaker in Mr Rule to the Guild. This is a process that has roots from over 800 years ago and is an honor bestowed upon only the highest quality craftsmen and women. Gunmaking is an incredibly rare and sacred craft and Mr Rule's immeasurable experience and knowledge is a credit to the future of the gunmaking industry."


